



Want Help With Your Transition To No-Till?

Become part of *Park the Plow for Profit*. The South Central PA
No-Till and Cover Crop Transition Program

Who Can Qualify to Participate?

- ✓ Any farm not currently using continuous no-till, or using on *less than 50%* of its acreage
- ✓ Farms in Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon and York Counties
- ✓ Up to 250 acres per farm is eligible for this program

What's Involved?

- ✓ *Park the Plow for Profit* will provide financial and technical assistance to help guide the producer through the transition to continuous no-till
- ✓ This assistance will be in the form of reimbursement payments for the development of a *no-till transition plan* (\$250) plus \$8/acre per year for technical assistance and planning services from a certified crop adviser or other service provider
- ✓ The program will also help interested farms find financial assistance in the form of a per-acre practice payment to help with additional transition costs (through existing programs)

What's the Farmer's Responsibility?

Farmers enrolled in the program must:

- ✓ Commit to keeping their enrolled fields in continuous no-till for at least three years
- ✓ Always use a cover crop following silage corn
- ✓ Use a planned rotation for at least three consecutive years
- ✓ Work with a technical advisor to develop a *no-till transition plan* for the enrolled acreage that follows the guidance developed for the project
- ✓ Agree to keep and submit records per the planning process
